- 3. That a monetary compensation for parks, in the amount of \$1 104.00 be paid the the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet.
- 4. That an impact study on the aggregate resource be submitted. It must demonstrate that the proposed development (creation of a new residential lot) will have no negative impact on the natural features or ecological functions for which the area has been identified (hibernation and significant woodlands).
