Draft copies of MDWLs and DWQPs were received December 7th 2020 for both drinking water systems. They were reviewed by OCWA, and only one minor change was submitted back to the Ministry.

That said, in order to complete the renewal process, OCWA is also required the council resolution approving the township's financial plan. The financial plan must meet the requirements of O. Please find enclosed a brief description of work performed for the period between from August 1st to August 31st, 2022.

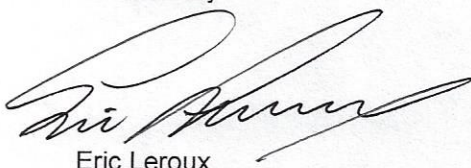
General Drainage concerns

- 1) André Lavigne- Schwab Branch- follow-up: observations of the watershed land use and how the Schwab Branch is being affected by these changes, and the schedule of assessments would require to have the cost share re-evaluated by a drainage engineer to reassess lands at the middle to upper watershed. The drain jurisdiction stops at the middle of the west half of lot 7 concession 8. The upper end of this drain as large lots where bush areas as been removed and many ditches were dug making water from the south lands flow faster instead of having the trees absorb most of this water. These lands had not been assess much cost at the time of the existing engineer's report Written in 1981. I find that sediment seeps downstream causing for tile drain system to be buried in the neighbour's field and maintenance is required every second of third year just to keep the watercourse flowing. We have prepared a landowners list to be invited to an onsite meeting to discuss the possibility that the municipality could appoint an engineer to review and present a new cost assessment schedule that would have fair cost shares that would reflect the conditions encountered when maintenance is needed.
- 2) We monitored the Demers and 11th Concession municipal drains to see if any nuisance beaver activity would cause restriction on the two drains following the ditch bottom clean out performed on the Demers drain, and removal of beaver dams at the 11th Concession drain.

- 3) I went to meet a landowner requiring explanation and request to rectify and error of an invoice they received for maintenance to the André Lavigne main drain done last year. I went to meet the owners to explain where the drain was and how it gives an outlet to surface water from part of their land. I also showed them a plan and engineer's report with description of their roll number. They were glad that I stopped by to give them this information as this is a drain that will need more maintenance to stabilise lower slopes from erosion on a section between county road 9 and concession 8.
- 4) I had many communications with the engineer's that were appointed to provide the report and supersede over the Michel Viau municipal drain to have the final draft of the assessment schedule for section 1A that was completed over a year ago. I had received a draft before, and asked that they review some items that had either been added but not performed, or not added to be assessed. We finally received the final draft that we agreed with all items. We prepared the schedule and will be able to apply for the grant for new construction and also assess cost after it will be presented to the municipal council to pass a by-law to assess cost.
- 5) I was asked to specify details on how Dickinson Creek is related to the Cobb's Lake Creek municipal drain. I sent these details to specify why Alfred-Plantagenet is part of the watershed of this municipal drain. The Dickinson Creek is a natural water course that gives outlet to a large watershed mostly situated in the municipality of Alfred-Plantagenet flowing in a parallel direction to Cobb's Lake Creek which is in the municipality of Clarence-Rockland. Dickinson Creek outlets in the Cobb's Lake Creek south of concession 10, west of the village of Pendleton in the municipality of the Nation. That is the reason that land owners in the watershed of the Dickinson Creek are assessed cost for the new engineer's report that should be sent to landowners with an invitation to attend a special meeting to consider the report at the City of Clarence-Rockland being the initiators of this report. A copy of the final report will be sent to every landowner within the watershed, including the councils of the three municipalities being Clarence-Rockland, Alfred-Plantagenet, and the Nation being the section where the Cobb's Lake Creek will outlet into the South Nation River. This procedure is necessary to be able to perform maintenance to have a sufficient outlet as the drain does not flow well and water levels are high and caused many issues and concerns for many owners along the drain.

Hoping the above is to your satisfaction, I remain.

INTRODUCTION

Depuis novembre 2020, l'entreprise IGS Hawkesbury travaille à la mise en œuvre d'un nouveau service Internet haute vitesse pour les résidents d'Alfred.

IGS Hawkesbury a initialement présenté le projet au conseil le 1er décembre 2020 et offert des mises à jour lors des réunions du 15 juin 2021 et du 23 août 2022.

Lors de la réunion du 23 août 2022, le conseil a mandaté l'administration de mener un sondage auprès des citoyens visés (69 résidences) par la consultation publique d'IGS Hawkesbury.

La consultation s'est déroulée du 25 au 31 août 2022. L'administration a pu joindre 53 résidents sur 69, soit 76.8%. Les résultats du sondage sont détaillés ici-bas sous la section "commentaires".

NATURE DE LA DEMANDE

Le présent rapport a pour but de présenter les résultats du sondage mené par l'administration auprès des 69 résidents d'Alfred afin de mesurer l'intérêt envers le projet d'IGS Hawkesbury. Dans un deuxième temps, IGS Hawkesbury recherche une résolution d'appui du conseil pour transmettre à ISDE et de procéder à l'implantation du projet à Alfred.

CONTEXTE LÉGAL

En vertu du paragraphe 4.2 du document CPC-2-0-03 — Systèmes d'antennes de radiocommunications et de radiodiffusion d'ISED, tout promoteur de projet (IGS Hawkesbury) doit tenir une consultation publique selon les normes prescrites. Cette consultation s'est déroulée de juin à juillet 2022 auprès de 69 résidences d'Alfred.

COMMENTAIRES DES AUTRES SERVICES

Sans objet.

IMPLICATIONS FINANCIÈRES

Aucune. Il convient de préciser que le canton ne tirera aucun avantage financier de la mise en œuvre du projet d'IGS Hawkesbury.

COMMENTAIRES

Voici les démarches qui ont été prises par l'administration depuis la directive conseil du 23 août 2022 :

Le 25 août 2022, le site *IGS Hawkesbury- la solution Terragraph pour Alfred* a été publié sur www.onjaseap.com afin de permettre aux gens visés par la consultation publique d'avoir accès à l'information distribuée par IGS Hawkesbury.

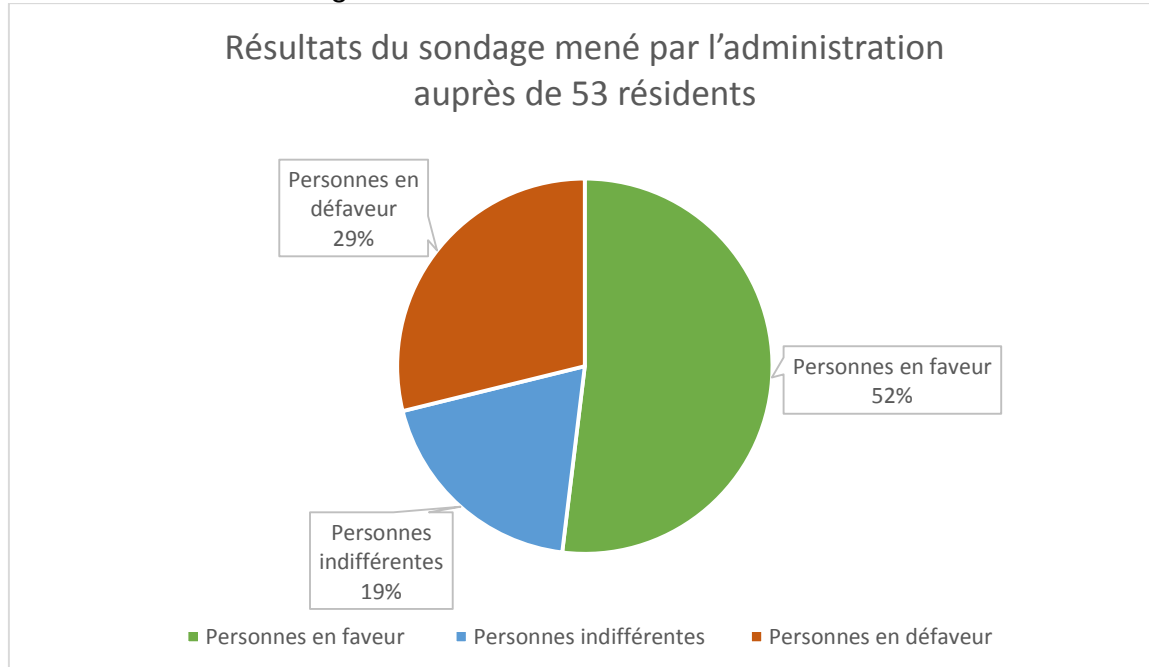
Un court sondage (en pièce jointe) a également été créé afin de cumuler l'information prise en personne ou par téléphone.

Le 25 août 2022, l'administration a pu joindre 32 personnes et administrer le sondage par téléphone.

Le 26 août 2022, l'administration a fait du porte-à-porte pour tenter de joindre les 37 autres résidents. Vingt personnes ont voté en personne lors de cette visite. Une personne a refusé de se prononcer ou de participer au sondage. Seize lettres ont été laissées aux résidences où personne n'a répondu à la porte.

En date du 31 août (date de la fin du sondage), 53 personnes ont été jointes et ont votées; 16 personnes n'ont pas répondu au sondage, malgré les efforts de l'administration de les rejoindre.

Les résultats du sondage sont les suivants :



Le sondage qui a été fait auprès de 53 résidents affectés par la consultation publique de IGS Hawkesbury démontre donc qu'il y a 27 personnes en accord avec le projet, 11 personnes indifférentes/ qui ont refusé de répondre et 15 personnes ont affirmées s'opposer au projet.

Prochaines étapes:

- Advenant que le Conseil reçoive favorablement la demande d'appui d'IGS Hawkesbury à la rencontre du 6 septembre, le promoteur en avisera ISDE dans les meilleurs délais;
- l'approbation finale d'ISDE au projet d'IGS Hawkesbury pourrait être accordée dans les 14 jours;
- les premières connections au service Internet haute vitesse pourrait se faire dès la mi-octobre et devrait se poursuivre jusqu'à la fin décembre 2022;
- IGS Hawkesbury estime que leur réseau pourrait desservir environ 620 résidences dans Alfred, soit approximativement 95% des résidents du noyau d'Alfred.

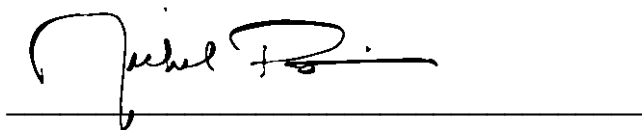

7.4.2.3.1 *Autorisations de morcellement de lots agricoles*

La taille des lots agricoles doit être maintenue aussi grande que possible, et les autorisations de morcellement de lots agricoles ne seront prises en considération que si l'autorité approbatrice estime :

1. *que les lots sont d'une taille appropriée pour le type d'utilisations agricoles courantes dans la région (dans les Comtés unis de Prescott et Russell, les parcelles séparées et conservées doivent avoir une taille générale de 40 hectares);*

RÈGLEMENT DE ZONAGE

La propriété sujette à la présente demande est zonée «Agricole (A)» dans le Règlement de zonage No. 2009-50 du Canton d'Alfred et Plantagenet.

Le paragraphe 22.2 (a) du Règlement fixe la superficie minimum d'un lot destiné à des fins agricoles à 30.0 hectares et la façade minimum à 60.0 mètres. Selon les dimensions proposées dans la demande d'autorisation B-039-2022, le lot retenu (B) et le lot détaché (A) s'avèrent respectivement conformes à ces dispositions.

Le zonage actuel permet que la propriété (lot détaché) soit utilisée pour des fins résidentielles. 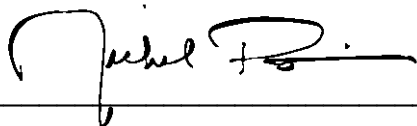

Impact financier du derecho du 21 mai 2022 et programme d'aide aux municipalités pour la reprise après une catastrophe

DATE: le 6 septembre 2022
FILIÈRE : DG-16-2022

INTRODUCTION

Vers 16h00, le 21 mai 2022, un violent orage de type derecho a frappé de plein fouet le territoire du Canton d'Alfred et Plantagenet. Heureusement, aucun décès n'a été constaté.

Les dégâts matériels sont toutefois importants. Des milliers d'arbres se sont affaîssés dans tous les secteurs du Canton, notamment sur les voies publiques, en bordure de notre réseau routier, dans nos parcs municipaux et, évidemment, sur les propriétés privées.

Les efforts du Canton se sont rapidement tournés vers le nettoyage des dégâts de la tempête, notamment la collecte et le déchiquetage des branches, arbres et souches.

Un premier rapport faisant état des constats initiaux a été présenté au conseil le 7 juin dernier, lors de laquelle le Conseil a autorisé l'administration « à encourir toutes dépenses jugées nécessaires et raisonnables en lien avec la tempête du 21 mai 2022, incluant l'exercice de collecte des branches, arbres et souches. »

À ce jour, les frais encourus par la municipalité en lien avec le derecho sont de l'ordre de 523 973\$, une somme très importante qui n'avait évidemment pas été budgétée.

Afin d'atténuer l'impact budgétaire, le Canton entend soumettre une demande de remboursement de ces dépenses à la province de l'Ontario sous le Programme d'aide aux municipalités pour la reprise après une catastrophe. Ce programme aide spécifiquement les municipalités à absorber les coûts extraordinaires liés à une catastrophe naturelle. **Un document explicatif du programme est inclus en pièce jointe.**

Il convient de préciser que la somme ci haut n'inclut pas les dommages causés aux infrastructures municipales. Nous estimons que 34 infrastructures municipales ont été endommagées, dont les couts sont estimés à ce jour à 148 010.81\$. Ces dommages devront faire l'objet d'une réclamation auprès de l'assureur de la municipalité. Nous anticipons que la quasi-totalité de ces coûts seront recouvrables, moins notre franchise de 10 000\$.

NATURE DE LA DEMANDE

Le présent rapport a pour but d'offrir une mise à jour au Conseil quant à l'impact financier du derecho et d'obtenir une résolution du Conseil appuyant la demande de remboursement du Canton d'Alfred et Plantagenet à la province de l'Ontario en vertu du Programme d'aide aux municipalités pour la reprise après une catastrophe.

CONTEXTE LÉGAL

Le ministre des Affaires municipales et du Logement décide d'activer le *Programme d'aide aux municipalités pour la reprise après une catastrophe* en se fondant sur les données probantes indiquant que le phénomène répond aux critères d'admissibilité à l'Aide aux municipalités pour la reprise après une catastrophe.

Le processus d'examen tient compte :

- de la cause et de l'ampleur des dommages;
- de la demande initiale présentée par la municipalité.

Si le programme est activé, la province et la municipalité concluent un accord de subvention. Tous les paiements effectués aux termes de cet accord sont fondés sur les coûts admissibles engagés par la municipalité par suite de la catastrophe naturelle.

Les municipalités disposent de 120 jours civils suivant la date du début d'une catastrophe naturelle pour présenter une demande au Programme. Le Canton doit donc soumettre sa demande initiale d'ici le 19 septembre 2022.

COMMENTAIRES DES AUTRES SERVICES

IMPLICATIONS FINANCIÈRES

Conformément au principe du partage de la responsabilité en matière de gestion des catastrophes, le Programme d'aide aux municipalités pour la reprise après une catastrophe est basé sur une formule de partage des coûts à échelle progressive.

Cette formule est appliquée lorsque les coûts admissibles représentent au moins 3 % des impôts que la municipalité prélève à ses fins.

Aux fins du Programme, les impôts prélevés à ses fins par une municipalité sont fondés sur le plus récent Rapport d'information financière qu'a présenté cette municipalité et les renseignements qu'elle a déclarés dans la rubrique SLC 10 0299 01 (« impôts prélevés à ses fins ») de ce rapport.

Basé sur le Rapport d'information financière de 2020 du Canton, les impôts prélevés étaient de l'ordre de 8 258 236\$. Sur la base de ce qui précède, 3% de cette somme équivaut à 247 747\$. En date d'aujourd'hui, nous avons cumulé des dépenses de l'ordre de 523 973\$. Nous atteignons donc le seuil requis.

Si les coûts admissibles engagés par une municipalité atteignent le seuil de 3 % **et que le Programme est activé**, la province rembourse à la municipalité 75 % de ses dépenses jusqu'à concurrence de 3 % des impôts qu'elle a prélevés à ses fins. La municipalité est responsable des 25 % restants. Quant aux dépenses admissibles qui dépassent ce seuil de 3 %, la province en rembourse 95 % à la municipalité, et cette dernière assume les 5 % restants.

Le scénario ci bas n'est qu'à titre d'exemple, puisque nous anticipons des dépenses additionnelles :

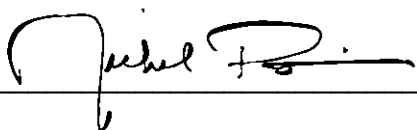
RECOMMANDATION

Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance Program

Purpose

- This presentation is intended to provide an overview of the **Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance** program.
- For guidelines and further details on disaster recovery programs, including eligibility and application requirements, visit Ontario.ca/DisasterAssistance (or contact your Municipal Services Office.)

Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance: Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible, a municipality must:

1. Have experienced a sudden and unexpected natural disaster with certain costly impacts.
2. Incur eligible incremental costs **that can be demonstrably linked to the event**, and meet or exceed 3% of the municipality's Own Purpose Taxation (OPT) levy.
 - Costs up to 3% OPT: province pays 75%, municipality pays 25%.
 - Costs beyond 3% OPT: province pays 95%, municipality pays 5%.
3. Submit the following within 120 calendar days of the event:
 - A resolution of council requesting assistance
 - Initial claim with costs incurred and future estimated costs
 - Detailed supporting documentation

Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance:

How it works

1. Natural disaster occurs

- MMAH monitors the province for disasters, with info from local partners.

2. Disaster assessed by MMAH

- MMAH staff will provide information and outreach to the municipality.

3. Ongoing recovery

- Municipality tracks incremental disaster-related costs, with MMAH to advise.

4. Municipality requests assistance

- Deadline is 120 calendar days from onset of the disaster.

5. Activation decision

- MMAH reviews information from municipality and may enter into grant agreement if the municipality is eligible for assistance.

Considering an application: Key items

- Activation of **Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance** is based on documented costs and well-supported future estimates, **not preliminary assessments**.
- A municipality's OPT levy is **SLC 10 0299 01 ("Taxation-Own Purposes")** from the most recent Financial Information Return on record with MMAH.
- Before requesting assistance, municipalities should **self-assess** their eligibility against the program guidelines and collect sufficient supporting documentation to demonstrate costs meet or exceed 3% of its OPT levy and disaster-relatedness.

Sliding scale cost-sharing formula

In keeping with the principle of shared responsibility for disaster management, if the program is activated, the following cost-sharing formula is applied to total eligible costs

If the program is activated, the following formula is applied	Provincial Funding	Municipal Funding
First 3% of OPT levy	75%	25%
Beyond 3% of OPT levy	95%	5%

MDRA cost-sharing exercise

A municipality with a \$30 million annual Own Purpose Taxation levy experiences a tornado and incurs \$1.5 million in eligible costs.

- How do we determine whether the municipality has reached the 3% activation threshold?
- Is the municipality eligible for assistance, assuming its documentation is in order? Why or why not?



Let's calculate!

The municipality is eligible

- Calculate 3% OPT: $\$30,000,000 \times 0.03 = \$900,000$
 - Eligible costs (\$1.5 million) more than 3% of the municipality's OPT levy
- Costs will be shared this way:

Eligible Disaster-Related Costs	Provincial Contribution	Municipal Contribution
Costs $\leq$ 3% OPT: \$900,000	\$675,000 (75%)	\$225,000 (25%)
Costs $>$ 3% OPT: \$600,000	\$570,000 (95%)	\$30,000 (5%)
Total eligible costs: \$1,500,000	\$1,245,000	\$255,000

- Provincial payment: \$1,245,000

Organizing supporting documentation

Immediately following a natural disaster, municipalities should establish a **segregated General Ledger account** to track disaster-related costs separately from regular expenses (if not already created).

- With a segregated general ledger, a municipality's claim can be reconciled to the municipality's audited financial statements for the fiscal year, or years, in which disaster-related expenses were incurred.
- The municipality should assign accounting codes that clearly distinguish between disaster-related operating and capital costs.

****Best practice**—creating a segregated general ledger account **before** a disaster occurs will save you time and enable you to begin immediately tracking disaster-related costs separately from regular expenses.

What supporting documentation does a municipality need?

- Municipalities are encouraged to attach as much relevant supporting information as possible to help substantiate claims.
- The success of a claim largely rests on the municipality's ability to demonstrate that incurred costs are linked to the natural disaster.
- Examples may include:
 - o Reports or assessments, from staff or external experts, on the specific damage to property or infrastructure.
 - o Photos or videos of pre-disaster, post-disaster and post clean-up conditions.
 - o Documentation of costs such as: invoices, procurement and employee contracts, equipment logs and purchase requisitions.
 - o Asset management plans and engineering reports to help determine pre-disaster condition.

“Is this cost eligible?”

- A frequent issue from past disaster assistance experiences is determining whether an expense is eligible.
- When considering an individual expense in an MDRA claim, the municipality should consider the following questions:
 - ✓ Is it directly related to the event?
 - ✓ Was it incurred to protect public health, safety and access to essential services?
 - ✓ Is it incremental to standard operating and capital budgets?
 - ✓ Was it paid or are there detailed estimates of future costs?
 - ✓ Is there supporting documentation to substantiate the above questions?
- YES (to all): Reasonable to assume the cost is eligible.
- NO (to one or more): Expense should either be removed from the claim or its eligibility should be clarified with the MSO.

Eligible costs

- For the purposes of this program, all eligible disaster-related expenditures are divided into two broad categories: **operating costs and capital costs**.
- For both operating and capital costs, only incremental costs –costs that would not have been incurred had the disaster not occurred and are above the amount the municipality normally budgets and spends – are eligible under the program.
- Within the operating and capital categories, costs are separated into the following sub-categories: **Goods & Services, Employee Costs, Claimant-Owned Equipment and Future Estimated Costs**.
- Costs incurred to improve property and infrastructure beyond pre-disaster condition are ineligible.
- Municipalities must also report any disaster-related revenue, if applicable.

Ineligible costs

- Most cases where items are found to be partially eligible or ineligible are due to lack of disaster-relatedness and/or repairs beyond pre-disaster condition.
- Costs that are ineligible include:
 - Replacement of trees
 - Repair of damaged private roads
 - Equipment that remains an asset to the municipality
 - Employee overtime that is banked as vacation days rather than paid out
 - Gratuities for meals
- More examples can be found in the MDRA Program Guidelines.

Creating a master reference document

- A **Master Reference Document** is a scanned document that contains all supporting documentation in a manner that is organized and numbered sequentially.

How to create a Master Reference Document:

- Scan documents into one PDF and number the pages sequentially.
- If there are too many documents for one PDF file, separate the documents and continue to number the pages sequentially
 - e.g., 1-1000, 1001-2000
- PDF file(s) and Claim Forms should be password-protected and titled with the year in which the disaster occurred, the full legal name of the municipality, and the number of each file within the batch of PDF files (if applicable).
 - e.g., 2016 – Municipality of Gold Standard – 2 of 4.pdf

Claim form tips

- Documentation requirements are designed to prove that costs are eligible and should tell a complete story, e.g., what work was done, why was it done, when was it done, who did the work and where, and how much it cost.
- External service providers should include a detailed description of the work contractors are completing. Contractors may be working on multiple activities, some of which may be ineligible under the program.
- Regular employee hours are not eligible, even if the employee was diverted to disaster-related work. Only overtime related to the disaster and paid out is an eligible expense. Pay stubs should demonstrate overtime was paid out.
- Link equipment and employee hours to disaster-related activities. Time sheets for equipment must be carefully recorded to substantiate total hours of use to be considered eligible under the program.
- Future costs for eligible capital repairs must be accompanied by detailed damage report estimates.

Future estimated costs

- Damage may have affected infrastructure and public facilities, but the damage cannot be fully assessed or repair work undertaken before the MDRA application deadline.
- A municipality would submit the known and “future estimated cost” associated with the damage (appraisal, repair, etc) as outlined below.

Required at time of Claim Application	Required during Claim Review
1. Detailed damage report- typically from an engineer, with an assessment of damage related to the disaster as well as a detailed cost estimate of materials and labour required to repair the damages.	3. Request for proposals for external service providers for materials and labour required for the capital repairs. Provide a copy of the final bid to the Ministry and the contract detailing the work.
2. Photos, asset management plans and other reports showing both the pre-disaster and post-disaster condition of the damaged infrastructure.	4. Invoices for work and services rendered by the service providers. Invoices must be for work and materials that were linked to the disaster in Step 1. Also, provide proof of payment such as a copy of the General Ledger.

Submitting a Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance Claim

- Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance claim applications must be submitted electronically to a Municipal Services Office.
- The initial claim package must include:
 1. MDRA Claim Forms in an active Excel format.
 2. All relevant supporting documentation scanned into a page-numbered PDF.
 3. Municipal council resolution requesting program activation.
 4. Signed attestation form (found in claim forms package). The form must include a **handwritten** signature of the person who has been delegated authority to submit the claim.

4. 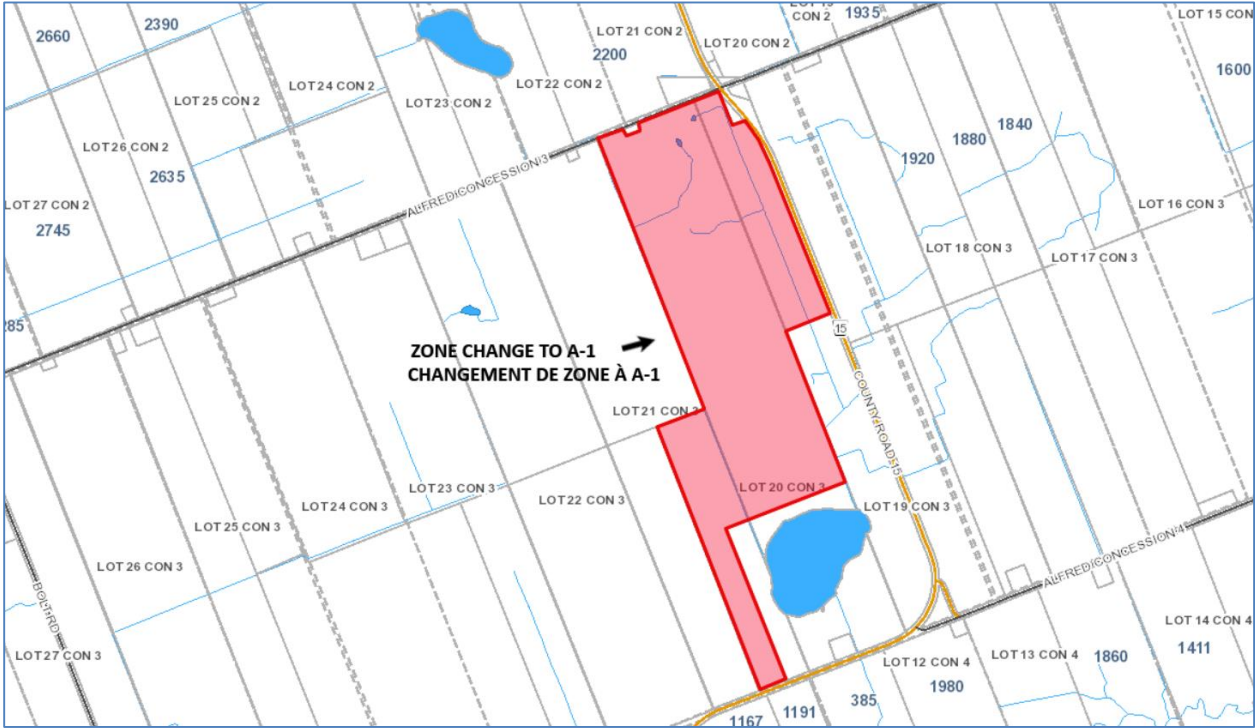

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to change the zoning category of a part of the property, identified in red on the sketch included herewith, from the "Agricultural (A)" zone to the "Agricultural – Exception 1 (A-1)" zone. The zoning category "A-1" prohibits the construction of any building used for residential purposes on the property.

The property concerned by this Zoning By-law amendment is presently the subject of an application for a consent approval under the *Planning Act*, file B-039-2022.

AMO Policy Update – Provincial Health News from a Municipal Lens Canada Child Care Plan Update

Flood Hazard Identification and Mapping Program

Provincial Health News from a Municipal Lens

The Deputy Premier and Minister of Health, the Honourable Sylvia Jones, made a series of health system announcements on [August 17th](#) at the close of the AMO conference and on [August 18th](#) that are of direct interest to municipal councils and staff.

Items of direct municipal interest include:

- The province announced nearly \$764 million in funding to assist municipalities with the cost of their paramedic services operations. This is an average increase of five per cent provincially compared to 2021-22 funding levels.
- The expansion of patient care models for eligible 9-1-1 patients to provide timely access to appropriate treatment in the community and help reduce unnecessary emergency department visits.
 - Currently, these patient care models enable paramedics to treat and refer mental health and addictions and palliative care patients to appropriate services in the community where available.
 - The government is working with key partners to expand these models to different patient groups, such as people with diabetes and epilepsy, and implement a new treat and release model with recommendations to patients for appropriate follow-up care.
- Ontario is providing approximately \$47 million through to the end of 2023 to public health units and municipalities to provide financial stability so they can deliver key public health services across the province.
 - This funding announcement is very welcome.
 - It is in addition to continuing the increased provincial investments to support the public health sector's response to COVID-19.
- Ontario is implementing processes to improve ambulance offloading currently being experienced by patients and paramedic services.
- Ontario is introducing legislation that, if passed, will support patients whose doctors have said they no longer need hospital treatment and should instead be placed in a long-term care home while they wait for their preferred home.
- Ontario will continue to fund community paramedicine to provide additional care for seniors in their own homes before their admission to a long-term care home.
 - AMO is very supportive of community paramedicine programs as it is cost-efficient and keeps people in their homes where they prefer to be. However, for years we have urged that it needs a legislative base and stable funding rather than pilot funding. AMO's June 2021 joint paper with the Ontario Association of Paramedic Chiefs (OAPC) on our [proposed CP policy framework](#) is here for your reference.

The province will continue to provide COVID-19 and flu shots to Ontarians as

they can stay up to date with their vaccinations to protect themselves and reduce the number of hospitalizations.

We understand that additional details will follow over the fall from the Ministries of Health and Long-Term Care on these expanded initiatives. We will provide updates when available.

Canada Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) Implementation Plan Update

The Ministry has updated the 2022 CWELCC Guidelines and O. Reg 137/15, making key changes to support participation in the CWELCC System. These include:

- extending enrolment dates to November 1, 2022, for licensees to sign on to the CWELCC system
- directing service system managers (SSMs) to process applications and confirm eligibility within 10 calendar days of date of application
- directing SSMs and licensees to execute an agreement within 30 calendar days of date of application
- requiring licensees to provide rebates to families within 20 calendar days of receiving funding from the SSM
- confirming that licensees applying to the CWELCC System may withdraw their application at any time, or terminate their participation in the System, subject to the terms of their CWELCC System service agreement; CMSMs/DSSABs may not impose any penalties related to a licensee's termination
- clarifying that licensees operating as for-profit corporations or individuals can continue to earn profit and licensees operating as not-for-profit corporations will be permitted a surplus amount to build reserves or reinvest in the organization.

Municipalities must share an example of a standard agreement with all licensed operators in their region by August 29, 2022 and meet corresponding deadlines for processing of applications. Despite these extended deadlines, parents should still see savings on average of 50% by December 31, as originally scheduled.

As next steps, consultations have begun with the Minister's Advisory Group to support the development of the Child Care Funding Formula which is planned for implementation in 2023. The Ministry also plans to consult with child care partners on additional CWELCC priorities, including workplace recruitment and retention, and the development of a growth and inclusion framework to support space expansion priorities as well as the needs of vulnerable and diverse populations. CMSMs/DSSABs will be expected to develop space expansion plans and build on existing community service plans for submission to the Ministry in late 2022.

Ontario Now Accepting Applications for Flood Hazard Identification and Mapping Program (FHIMP)

On August 12th, the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF), in partnership with Natural Resources Canada (NRCAN), launched applications for the [Federal Flood Hazard Identification and Mapping Program](#). Up to 50% matched federal funding can be received for eligible flood mapping projects.

Applications from municipalities, Indigenous communities, planning authorities, and conservation authorities are encouraged and will be accepted until 4:30pm EST on September 16, 2022.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ALFRED AND PLANTAGENET

BY-LAW NUMBER 2022-52

A By-law to confirm the proceedings of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet at its meeting held on September 6, 2022.

WHEREAS section 5 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, provides that the powers of a municipal corporation are to be exercised by its council.

AND WHEREAS section 11 of the said *Municipal Act* provides that the powers of every council are to be exercised by by-law.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the proceedings of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet at this meeting be confirmed and adopted by by-law;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet enacts as follows:

1. **THAT** actions of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet in respect of each motion and resolution passed and other action taken by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet at this meeting is hereby adopted and confirmed as if all such proceedings were expressly embodied in this By-Law.
2. **THAT** the Presiding Officer and the appropriate officials of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the action of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet referred to in the preceding section.
3. **THAT** the Presiding Officer, or in his absence, the appointed Acting Presiding Officer and the Clerk, or in the absence of the Clerk, the Deputy Clerk, are authorized and directed to execute all documents necessary on that behalf and to affix thereto the corporate seal of the Corporation of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet.
